One of the things guests often ask us is what to order when you want something a little bit special so we've built a short list of the very best wines and whiskies that money can buy. So whether you're celebrating or just curious, do have a look at our Connoisseurs Collection.

Our first 2 wines come from Bordeaux and have illustrious links with Scotland.

Celebrate the Auld Alliance!

Bin 32: Ch. Smith Haut Lafite 1993 £39.50
Appellation Pessac-Leognan Controlee 12.5%

This vineyard is said to be planted by a Scotsman named George Smith in 1720. He ended up in disgrace having left his wife for a local peasant girl called Elisabeth Louis. The property left the family in 1793 and for a brief time it was German owned and went by the name Ch. Schmidt! Since 1921 it's gone back to its original name.

Made from Sauvignon Blanc grapes and fermented in new wood, this white wine is full flavoured with a gentle fruitiness. It's fine quality complements foods such as chicken and light meats.

Bin 33: Ch. Ducru-Beaucaillou 1978 £64.00
Appellation St-Julien Controlee; 2e Grand Cru Classe

The vineyard was named after it's very gravelly vineyard (beaux calloux), which is perfect for fine wine making, and Bertrand Ducru who became its owner in 1795. It's more famous for the activities of the Johnston family. These Scots traders arrived in Bordeaux in the 1720s and eventually got involved in the wine trade. Such was their standing as negociants and wine makers that Nathaniel Johnston was invited to the celebrated 1855 classification of wines from the Medoc and Graves.

It was in the 1880's that Bordeaux mixture was accidentally discovered at this chateaux when it was under their ownership. Today this remedy for mildew is still in use and the negociants, Raoul Johnston are still in business.

This exceptionally well-regarded vineyard produces 'super-second' wines that rate with the very best premier cru. The blend of Cabernet Sauvignon and Merlot grapes, at the peak of maturity, make this a wonderful wine to drink. Perfect with either venison or haggis, and good with almost any red meat!
